# **Ethical Framework [includes legal]**

### SIZA – Sustainability Initiative of South Africa


Aims to promote sound and ongoing improvement of ethical labour practices in SA Agriculture

## SFI – The Sustainability Fruit Initiative

WWF-SA has developed the SFI – and ENVIRONMENTAL programme for the Fruit Industry with the goal of being incorporated as the environmental pillar of the SIZA Programme.

### FOCUS ON SMALL SUPPLIERS

### Understand the context

- Less structured
- Limited resources

### • Step up approach - towards compliance instead of third party audit

- Affordable
- •Support, monitor and measure improvement over time

## THE CYCLE

Step 1: Training / Awareness raising

Step 5: Monitoring Corrective Actions & Improvement Plan Step 2: Internal Assessment of suppliers by SHP ; identifying non-compliances and areas of risk (conducted annually)

Step 4: Implementation of Improvement Plan Step 3: Report & needs analysis based on internal assessment; Development of individual & group Improvement Plan



#### Legislation

All permits and agreements in place including the SHP membership agreement (20% increase)

#### Conservation of Biodiversity

SHP maps have been created for the members (0.61% increase) – WF = SHP Spp lists for each property, indicate zonation on map

#### Sustainable use of resource

2 of the 5 suppliers have completed their SHP in-field training, 43 trained (2.5% increase) – WF = all members to complete in-field training, data sharing agreements agreed and data submitted to FVCT as well as further field assessments


#### Management plans

Formalise this within the SIZA bolt on with engagement from stakeholders and then create these plans for each member

#### Research and monitoring

4 of the 5 supplier's field monitors completed FM in-field training, 9 trained (40% increase) – WF = train remaining field monitors and train Champions for each member
